National/Donor Level

Indicators in Development related to CHCT

- ◆ PEPFAR II Indicators
 - ◆ Required indicators for PEPFAR reporting
 - ◆ Recommended indicators for national level
- ◆ WHO Guide for Monitoring and Evaluation for National Programs for HIV Testing and Counseling

PEPFAR II and WHO Indicators

- ◆ Number of individuals who received Testing and Counseling (T&C) services for HIV and received their test results during the past 12 months
- ◆ Disaggregated by
 - ◆ sex
 - ◆ age
 - ◆ type of counseling (individual or couple)

PEPFAR II and WHO Indicators

- ◆ Number of couples who underwent HIV T&C and received results together from any service delivery point.
- ◆ Disaggregated by couple results:
 - ◆ Discordant
 - ◆ Concordant Positive
 - ◆ Concordant Negative
- ◆ Note: this indicator is not intended to capture MCP, and follow HIV trends in stable sexual partnerships

Site/Program Level Data Collection

- ◆ Data collection tools
 - ◆ Log books
 - ◆ Client data forms
 - ◆ Monthly / quarterly reporting forms

Existing Data Elements

- ◆ Demographic information
 - ◆ Unique ID number
 - ◆ Gender
 - ◆ Age
 - ◆ Marital status?
- ◆ Behavioral risk information
 - ◆ Reason for testing
- ◆ Test result

New Data Needs

- ◆ What new data do we need to capture in order to monitor CHCT programs?
 - ◆ Uptake of CHCT?
 - ◆ Type of couple?
 - ◆ Test results?
 - ◆ Link unique ID numbers
- ◆ What existing data do we need to eliminate for CHCT session?
 - ◆ Individual behavioral risk information?
 - ◆ Number of sex partners?

Improving Individual CT Data

- ◆ What additional information is useful for the individual CT session?
 - ◆ Does individual know partner's HIV status?
 - ◆ Partner HIV status should guide HIV counseling messages provided
 - ◆ Was individual referred for CHCT?
